I know Adam's supervising teacher appreciated learning from him, new ways to use technology for all aspects of instruction, from quick formative assessment, to engaging activities that allowed students to make their own discoveries.

Adam demonstrated a solid understanding of student developmental needs and how the school is structured to support students. Being fully dedicated to the sixth grade team, Adam was able to participate in the daily team meetings. He was an active, contributing member, offering insights on students that belied his lack of experience in this setting. Indeed, it was nice to have his new ideas and perspective enriching the discussions with insightful questions and creative suggestions. Adam even had the opportunity to speak at a grade level assembly, offering a nice combination of motivation and organizational suggestions to facilitate the students' adjustment to the middle school setting.
